8<sup>th</sup> Annual Educating Children of Color Summit Theme: Act Now for *YOUth*

Program Summary: Students will learn the skills to be a leader in their community and in their life through engaging workshops. Students have the opportunity to win scholarships, visit a college, and talk to college students. Parents will learn how to instill accountability from their child and their child's school and will learn about the pressures that their children face. Professionals will have the opportunity to rejuvenate their practice and maximize engagement with youth who live in a Hip-hop world.

### MILTON FOSTER CHILDREN'S FUND

Our Purpose: To enrich the lives of children in foster care throughout the Pikes Peak Region.



The Milton Foster Children's Fund (MFCF) provides opportunities that build resiliency, caring and support that are not funded by existing agencies or programs to enrich the lives of children in foster care in El Paso and Teller Counties.

MFCF can provide opportunities such as:

- Music/Sports Lessons or Camps
- · Educational Opportunities/Tutoring
- · Sports/Special Equipment

The foster parent, case worker or CASA must complete an application. The Allocations Committee meets once per month to review requests.

The Hanger is a clothes store for teens in foster care (ages 12-21) living in El Paso or Teller Counties. Teens can choose clothing and accessories free of charge. Teens can also volunteer to work in the store, as well as participate in exclusive parties, field trips and workshops.
